In June, we will successfully wrap up our second capital campaign - since the foundation's beginning in 1992, more than \$12 million has been

raised through capital campaigning. Of the total, \$5 million remains in our portfolio - \$4.4 million has been "invested" in 26 projects and 6 Ph.D. environmental science scholarships, and the balance expended for operating costs.

I'll bet most of you did not know that we raised \$12 million and I'll bet even more that you don't know just 80 corporations and individuals donated the funds! Literally a few have done much to benefit so many - and it's time for that to change.

Those who have given - all 80 - will be asked to continue to give in substantially lesser amounts, but for the foundation to truly have legs we must have the broad based support of thousands of donors. So I'm recommending to the EREF board a daunting task - to get sustaining support from a few thousand people who make their living in the waste service industry and induct them as EREF's first members of its annual sustaining support level, the "Eagle Club."

Every year we spend about \$1.2 to \$1.5 million on projects and another \$250,000 each year or so on operating expenses, but our small portfolio does not generate the interest needed to cover these costs. So, with the help of the many we would like to receive commitments from:

- 100 donors giving \$1,000 per year
- 500 donors giving \$500 per year
- 1,000 donors giving \$100 per year
- 2,000 donors giving \$50 or less per year

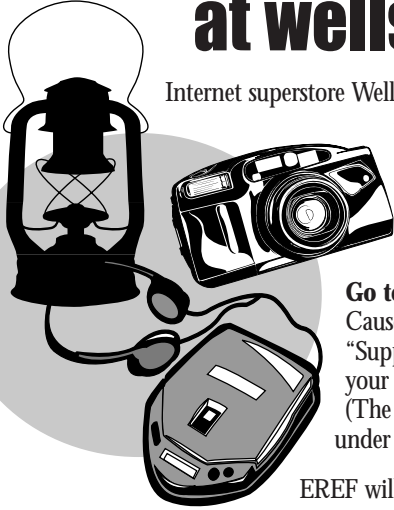

RESEARCH GRANT APPROVED

During its spring meeting held on April 11 in Orlando, Fla., the foundation's Board approved \$60,000 in funding to the Interstate Technologies and Regulatory Council (ITRC) Alternative Landfill Technologies Team for development of a technical and regulatory guidance document describing the methods states should use to oversee design, construction, monitoring, and post-closure care of alternative final covers at landfills including the use of alternative cap designs at bioreactor landfills.

This project will support another EREF project being performed by GeoSyntec Consultants that is developing a performance-based system for post-closure care at municipal solid waste landfills. The GeoSyntec project will be developing a new approach to the current 30-year time-based system required currently under federal regulations.
