



Scholarship Application Packet

Qualifications:

Applications will be considered from those who:

- will be this year or are now a full-time master's student, doctoral student or post-doctoral researcher, and
- have a clearly demonstrated interest in solid waste management research.

Scholarships recognize graduate students pursuing excellence in solid waste management research and education. Recipients are chosen based on credentials and potential contributions to the solid waste industry and its scientific community.

Awards are based on:

- Academic performance
- Professional experience
- Relevance of one's work to the advancement of solid waste management science
- Potential for success

Award amounts consider the cost of tuition at the recipient's institution and any other funds received. Full scholarships may not be awarded to students who will be receiving full-tuition scholarships from other sources (excluding direct university assistance such as tuition remission, or assistantship income) but may still be considered for partial awards.

Doctoral and post-doctoral scholarships are awarded up to a maximum of \$12,000 per year and paid monthly. Doctoral/post-doctoral scholarships are renewable each year to a maximum of three years from the initial award date. Master's scholarships are awarded up to a maximum of \$5,000 per year and renewable each year to a maximum of two years from the initial award date. Scholarship renewal is dependent upon satisfactory progress as determined by the student's academic advisor.

All qualified candidates will be considered for scholarships without regard to race, religion, national or ethnic origin, citizenship, or disability. Applications from students outside the United States or studying abroad will receive equal consideration. Award decisions by the Environmental Research and Education Foundation and its directors are final and not subject to appeal.

Scholarship Program Application Instructions

Application Materials (all items are REQUIRED)

1. **Signed application form.** Submit one original only.
2. **Official college transcripts.** Contact the registrar from each college or university attended and have official transcripts sent directly to the Environmental Research and Education Foundation. If your name was different on previous transcripts, note this when requesting the transcript and notify the Environmental Research and Education Foundation. For students attending institutions that do not issue transcripts, send other appropriate documentation. Transcripts (or other appropriate documentation) **are required** for a complete application package and **must be postmarked by the application deadline** to receive consideration.
3. **Admission test scores:** Students currently enrolled in a degree program (undergraduates or graduate students) should submit one copy (*not* original) of the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) results. GRE scores are **REQUIRED** unless sufficient justification can be provided. International students can find local test centers via ETS's GRE website (www.ets.org/gre). Students ineligible to take the GRE, who took the GRE >5 years ago, or who have taken exams other than the GRE (i.e. SAT, GMAT) should contact EREF prior to submitting an application to ensure these test results will be considered. A report stamped "*Candidate's Copy*" will suffice. Be sure to give your name, address, date of birth, social security number (or equivalent), school, and the location and date that you took the test. Scores should be included with the other application materials and sent to EREF by the applicant.
4. **Three recommendations:** A recommendation form is included in this application packet. This form should be copied and distributed to three individuals who can comment on your academic or career performance and your potential for future success. At least two of the recommendations must be less than one year old. The recommendation form should be completed and **returned to you** in a sealed envelope with the recommender's signature over the sealed flap. Recommendations will not be considered if they arrive in unsealed envelopes, or in envelopes that do not bear the recommender's signature. **Submit all recommendations with your application package.**
5. **Essays:** One copy of each of the following essays (please number pages):
 - a) an autobiographical statement (<500 words) that includes your career goals and any talents/interests you have that make you stand out as a candidate for an EREF Scholarship
 - b) a discussion of your research topic (<750 words) that includes project objectives and the work's relevance to the advancement of solid waste management.

Essays should be submitted typed, double-spaced, unbound and unstapled, with pages numbered, on 8 1/2 x 11 paper (international students using A4 paper must make sure text fits inside an 8 1/2 x 11 area). Candidates submitting material in any language other than English must provide an English translation.
